Principal's Report. Given by Peggy O'Neill

Thank you to the P&C for \$2,000 assistance with BATH day costs. 75% of the day is also spent on professional learning.

Parent/teacher for years 10 and 11 is 21 June, and 19 July for years 8 and 9.

Public Education Day assembly saw the launch of the anti bullying project. Posters for each room will be made for next year. The project seems to be working, there have been more suspensions in term 1 than ever before. Girls that have been suffering seem to be standing up and saying enough. Girls are advised of the consequences of their actions and given ways to take a 'solve it' approach to situations.

There is a possibility of holding a year 7 camp, or 2 day break, next year to reinforce the anti bullying message and give the girls strategies to prevent/deal with it.

A techno bullying seminar has been held to high light issues with mobile phones, email etc.

Library budget tabled.

Information on the current state on the collection of school fees was tabled. General contribution fees generally only get paid at the beginning of the year, where subject fees can come in throughout the year.

Thank you to the P&C from the dance group for the sponsorship of \$1,000 for dance costumes to be used at upcoming eistedfords.

9 girls to take part in the state soccer trials, would the P&C sponsor them @ \$50 each?. Tamara Mitchell has been selected for the NSW dance ensemble, possible P&C sponsorship of \$100.

Motion: To sponsor 9 girls @ \$50 each and 1 at \$100, total spend \$550.

Due to the large number of girls taking part in the various dance groups, it is recommended that a dance committee be set up to oversee and raise funds for the groups.

Treasurer's Report. Attached.

Cheque for \$4,500 received from the school and will be divided as follows:

add \$1,000 to grounds to total \$8,954.32, add \$2,000 to special projects to total \$3,729.38 and add \$1,500 to library fund to total \$20,228.

As the P&C has now received a library budget the following motion was proposed.

Fundraising.

A proposal to run a raffle was put forward, to sell 10 tickets @\$2 each, to win an entertainment package consisting of TV, Ipod, DVD player etc. The proposal is from an outside company that provides the tickets and prizes, however distribution/return of tickets and money could be a problem. The school feels only about 20% of tickets/money would be returned. Meeting proposed to sell tickets at parent/teacher nights, or have a stall at riverside markets, or the local shops on shop counters. Still to determine the lead time for receipt of ticket books. Propose that tickets be preordered. Advert to be included in the August/September newsletter and included with the mail out of anti bullying project information for parents in week 1 or 2.

Music.

Riverside Swings, possible date in September. There is a music meeting next week. The band committee is running a Trivia night on August 19.

The band won a silver medal at the Engadine Band Festival.

General Business

A parent asked about the possibility of having a school jacket, that can be worn over the jumper particularly in winter, to combat the cold. The SRC is having discussions with the designer/supplier of the uniform to find a suitable jacket that would look neat, suit the purpose and not be cost prohibitive.

Wearing of a white scivvy under the shirt in winter is acceptable.

The number of volunteers to assist with gelato sales on BATH day is good.
